# New releases from EASEED®

### **Pepper Yellow Gold F1**

Early maturing variety taking 65-75 days
Produces a 4-cubed blocky fruit with a thick wall
Has excellent keeping quality
Fruits turn from green to shiny yellow on maturity
Fruits weigh 150 - 180gm



#### **Cabbage Zawadi F1**

Great releave for farmers; notes Mr. Njenga wa Hannah a prominent cabbage farmer from Githunguri for Cabbage Zawadi F1 from East African Seed Co. Ltd. He notes that Zawadi F1 is a very compact cabbage suitable for long-distance transport with a very appealing bluish green colour. Its uniformity in growth is just amazing and so is its tolerance to problematic diseases like downy mildew and black rot. He encourages other farmers to go for Zawadi F1 because its field holding capacity is unchallenged.



#### **Maize KH500 - 43A**

After the successful release of hybrid Maize KH600 - 15A for high altitude areas, **EASEED** is proud to announce the release of hybrid maize **KH500 - 43A** for mid altitude areas. KH500 - 43A is an excellent double cobber, with tightly packed flint-like grains giving 30-40bags/acre. It is highly tolerant to maize streak virus and has a good husk cover to prevent rotting. KH500 - 43A is an early maturing variety (120-150days) and is recommended for planting in coffee growing areas in parts of Rift Valley, Central, Eastern, Nyanza and Western Kenya.



#### **Watermelon Sukari F1**

The adoption of Sukari F1 hybrid has been excellent. Farmers are impressed by its blocky oblong shaped fruits weighing 7-12kgs. Sukari F1 has exhibited high tolerance to most common diseases affecting cucurbits. The high TSS (12-13%) and good granular structure has made the variety one of the most sought for in the market. Most farmers have recorded yields of 25-35 tons/acre.

# **EASEED®** In Tanzania

In a bid to fight hunger and increase production at farmer level, **EASEED** Tanzania in collaboration with AVRDC has come up with a plan to introduce to our farmers a high yielding open pollinated tomato variety, **Tomato Meru**.

The variety has excellent characters to suit a wide range of ecological zones. The characters include;

- Drought tolerance, disease and pest resistance especially early and late blight diseases.
- Tomato Meru is an indeterminate variety that requires staking and thus high yields. The fruit weigh from 110gm 140gm.
- Fruit pulp is intense which allows for prolonged storage of about 21 days shelf life.
- Has high yield potential of 18-20 tones per acre.
- This variety is early maturing, good quality and shape which makes it very suitable for both local and distant market.
- Required plant spacing is 60 x 45 cm, or 60 x 60cm.

We urge all our farmers to take advantage of this new release and reap the benefits.

Health Tips

- Broccoli is well established as one of the major anti-cancer foods
- People who eat an abundance of broccoli have fewer cancers of the colon, breast, cervix, lungs, prostate, esophagus, larynx, and bladder.
- It contains indoles, which can help inactivate harmful estrogens that can promote the growth of tumors, sulforaphane, which stimulates cells to produce cancer-fighting enzymes, and beta-carotene, another cancer fighter.
- It contains some 3% of protein and is one of the richest vegetable sources of calcium, iron and magnesium.
   Moreover, broccoli is very rich in vitamins A and C, exceeding even oranges in the concentration of the latter.
- It can be eaten raw in salads or with dips, or it can be steamed and eaten as it is, or served with a lightnut, or similar sauce.
- It is a super source of chromium that helps regulate insulin and blood sugar.
- It is extremely strong in anticancer activity, particularly against lung, colon, and breast cancers.
- However, broccoli is one of the leading intestinal gas producers. To reduce its gas production,
   eat broccoli with ginger or garlic.


